Activities



1. Sidewalk Chalk

- ✓ Draw pictures of items that have your speech sound in them. Have others guess what they are. Practice your sound by saying the item you drew 5 times or make a sentence about your item.
- ✓ Draw a hopscotch track (or other shapes/numbers) on the ground and write words that have your speech sound in each square. Say each word using your good sounds as you hop through.
- ✓ Draw a tic-tac-toe board and write a word with your sound in each square. You & your speech helper practice your sound by saying the word 5 times as you make an "X" or "O" in that box.



RECIPE for SIDEWALK CHALK PAINT

- 1 cup flour
- 1 cup water
- 1 tablespoon dish soap
- 5-10 drops food coloring or washable paint



2. Play a Game

- ✓ Bankruptcy Game – Put a bunch of coins in a bag (that you cannot see through) but color one of the coins red. After saying a word that has your sound in it 5 times, you and your speech helper both pull out one coin. If anyone pulls out the red coin, they have to put all of their coins back (Bankrupt)! Whoever has the most coins after 5 minutes wins!
- ✓ Memory – Draw pictures of items that have your sound in them on index cards. (Example 2 Lollipops, 2 lions, 2 lemons, 2 lips, 2 lakes) Cut the cards in half. Then see who can find the most matches.
